INTERFAITH MOMENT: PASSOVER

22-30 APRIL 2016

15-22 Nisan/Aviv (@ the full-moon of 1st mo of Jewish liturgical year)

Passover is the Jewish celebration known as the festival of redemption. It is commonly understood as commemorating the night the Angel of Death passed over Hebrew households and killed all first-born Egyptian offspring, an event that preceded the Exodus. In the Jewish Diaspora, Passover is kept for eight days, while in Israel, it is only seven days long. This is so that any doubt about the proper beginning of the festival (based on the full moon) is covered.

A Seder is celebrated on at least the first night of Passover and possibly on the second in the Diaspora. Seder means the “order or arrangement,” of ritual and meal elements. It is an elaborate meal with family and friends. The script for the Seder is called the Haggadah. (Haggadah means “the telling.”) A Haggadah can be very traditional in its use of the Scripture, or it can be a very modern interpretation of the texts. Many scripts exist in many styles! Every celebration involves asking ritual questions beginning with, “Why is this night different from all other nights?” It also includes singing a song called *Dayenu*, which means, “It would have been enough.” Dayenu is the response to a litany of God’s deeds on behalf of the people.

The historical time period for the Exodus events is either the reign of Amenhotep (1514- 1493 BCE) or of Seti I/Ramses II (1305-1224 BCE). The actual events are explained according to the method of Scripture interpretation in use in the celebrating community. The range includes:

- The plagues/exodus are moral fables OR they are scientifically explainable/related events
- The exodus was a silent, sneaky operation OR the exodus was brought about by Pharaoh’s directive
- The biblical account is historically based, but deliberately constructed to theologically undermine Pharaoh and affirm YHWH

Unitarian Universalists for Jewish Awareness and the Society for Humanistic Jews celebrate Passover with a Seder that uses non-theistic and cultural expressions of Jewish identity. Their focus is on history, culture, literature, music, values/ethics, and reflecting on the work that still needs to be done to bring about a world free of slavery and modern ‘plagues.’
