SPECIAL TRAINING IN OWENSBORO

UUCO will be co-sponsoring a special training offered by Showing Up For Racial Justice (SURJ), a national organization for racial allies. The training is entitled: Bystander Intervention and De-Escalation. **It will be on Sunday, 23 April from 2-4 pm at the Public Library.** Trainers will be coming in from Louisville to teach that day. The workshop will cover some of the strategies we learned in our Welcoming Congregation formation, teach us even more, and give us the chance to practice with allies from other organizations.

It's very exciting that a broad coalition has formed regarding race relations in Owensboro and several organizations have agreed to co-sponsor this workshop with us: NAACP, AAUW, ODCMA, NonViolent Owensboro, Human Relations Commission, Black Expo, and the Library. Pre-registration is required through the library due to limited physical space (only 100 can attend,) but there is no charge so don't be shy about signing up!





**INTERFAITH MOMENT:
LAILAT AL MIRAJ, 23 APR**

Lailat al Miraj is a Muslim holiday. The story of Lailat al Miraj consists of two major parts. The first part of the story begins with the Prophet Muhammad at the Kabaa in Mecca. He is visited by two archangels who provide him with a mythical winged steed called Buraq. Buraq carries the Prophet to the ‘Farthest Mosque,’ believed by Muslims to be the Al Aqsa mosque in Jerusalem, where Muhammad joins past prophets in prayer.

The Prophet then ascends to heaven where he is told by God of the duty for Muslims to pray five times daily (Salat). This second part of the journey is commonly referred to as the Miraj, an Arabic word meaning “ladder.”

The events of Lailat al Miraj are described briefly in chapter 17 of the Quran, which is named “Sura Al-Isra” after the Prophet’s ascension to heaven. Many of the details of the story are filled in by hadith, supplemental writings about the life of the Prophet Muhammad.

Today Lailat al Miraj is observed by Muslims as one of the most important events in the history of Islam. Muslims may attend special prayer services at a mosque, or they may commemorate the holiday privately at home by telling the story to children or reciting special nighttime prayers.

FARMERS’ MARKET RE-OPENS

The Owensboro Regional Farmers’ Market will resume business on Saturday, 22 April to celebrate Earth Day. The Market is going to include Be Cool Go Green in the weekend festivities! In fact, many specially themed events are planned for this season.

The Market is located at the corner of Triplett and Parrish. It is open 8 am- 1 pm on Saturdays from April-October. It is also open on Tuesday and Thursday mornings from June-August. The Market accepts cash, credit cards, and EBT benefits. It is in the process of raising funds to build a permanent structure to allow year-round, weather protected healthy shopping.

For several years, the Market hosted the event called “Be Cool Go Green” later in the summer to feature city organizations concerned with environmental, ecological, and fair trade issues. As such, we participated by selling Equal Exchange coffee. **And we have been invited back to sell coffee on 22 April from 8 am- 12 noon!**
