even when we actually oppose each other.

O Spirit of Life, breathing within us:
This is not my place, but it is our place—built for the benefit of all.

We are grateful for this place.

When we gather here, may we also be respectful of the space we share:
may we regard it as a commons, use it wisely, and treat all who maintain it with deference.

Knowing not all neighbors will have access for all events,
May we hold the diversity of our community in care
Working ever to upbuild our city and improve our public life for everyone.
