DENOUNCE TORTURE OBSERVANCE

Sunday, June 24 at 3 pm, our 14th annual Denounce Torture Prayer Vigil will be held here at 1UU. We will gather to pray for the end of torture in all its forms. The guest preacher will be Dr. Elaine Wright, of Brescia University.

In addition to the prayer vigil, we will be hosting a lecture as part of our annual Denounce Torture Observances. This year's lecture will be a panel on Transgender Awareness, and will feature advocates Dixie Collinson, Emma Latta, and Deanna Smith. Representatives from both New Beginnings and The Foundation for Healing Through the Arts will also be present.

The panel will be held at IUU, on Tuesday, June 26 at 6 pm.

Transgender people face increased rates of poverty, homelessness and violence. This is especially true of transgender women of color. It can be difficult to assess the scope of the problem due to inconsistent reporting and frequent misgendering of victims by police. However, according to an article published by The New York Times last year, the murder rate of transgender women of color in the US is over 4 times higher than the national average. Human Rights Campaign is an lgbtq+ rights advocacy group that tracks reported instances of violence against transgender individuals in the US. They keep a list of transgender individuals that have died a violent death due to either hate crimes or increased risk status (i.e. higher levels of poverty and homelessness bring increased murder rates). Interfaith Moment

Laylat al Qadr June 11, starting sundown June 10

Laylat al Qadr, known as the Night of Power, is a very important Islamic holy day. It simultaneously stands connected to the past as a remembrance, and lives in the present as a sacred opportunity for prayer. As a remembrance, it commemorates the first night the Prophet Muhammed received the divine revelation that is the Qur'an. However, this night reaches into the future just as much as it stretches into the past, as it is considered a powerful night for prayer.

In a Huffinton Post article titled, "Why Laylat al Qadr is One of the Holiest Nights of Ramadan," the importance and power of this night is illustrated through a quote from the Qur'an:

The Quran mentions Laylat Al Qadr in one of its chapters, the Surat Al-Qadr:

We have indeed revealed this (Message) in the Night of Power:

And what will explain to thee what the night of power is?

The Night of Power is better than a thousand months.

Therein come down the angels and the Spirit by Allah's permission, on every errand:

Peace!... This until the rise of morn!

Even the date of Laylat al Qadr is shrouded in mystery. All that is known from the Qur'an and the Hadith is that it takes place near the end of Ramadan, so there are differing opinions. BBC Religions has this to say:

Lailat [sic] al Qadr takes place during Ramadan. The date of 27 Ramadan for this day is a traditional date, as the Prophet Muhammad did not mention when the Night of Power would be, although it was suggested it was in the last 10 days of the month.

Because of this, many Muslims will treat the last 10 days of the month of Ramadan as a particularly good time for prayer and reading the Qur'an.
